#### **PURPOSEFUL QUILTING**

I've been asked many times about my thoughts on the results of this year's Quilt Barn efforts. Wow....it was quite a whirlwind! Every year, opening weekend is always busy and this year was no different! Very exciting for sure! With that said, we sold so many king and queen quilts that I was calling quilters to find more to be able to fill our racks. Our dedicated quilters came through for us and we were so grateful. I thank you and our QB guests thank you as well. We sold many of the "second wave" of that quilt inventory. We also sold most of our wall hanging inventory so again, thank you! What else sold? Crib quilts and holiday items (Christmas, Halloween, Harvest) sold quite well. In other words, sales seem to fall into the same consistent categories which is great! We also sold a nice variety of traditional, transitional, and modern-styled quilts – QB customers appreciated it all. As always, quilts with touches of applique are always appealing, too. That extra little "something" can make all the difference.

What didn't sell is also important and provides food for thought. While king and queen quilts are the strongest sellers, other sizes sold but much fewer. As we've noted in the past, most beds are bigger than ever. Higher frames and deeper mattresses have certainly changed the sizes of the quilts that people need. One thing that is very important to note.... a king mattress is the only "square" mattress, so a square quilt looks best on that size bed. If you are making a square quilt (medallion or other), please be sure that it is large enough to fit a king bed – a minimum of 108" x 108". Any other mattress is rectangular, and a smaller square quilt simply doesn't fit well. As you know, we have both a king and queen bed set up in the QB for guests to try out the quilts for size. If a quilt doesn't fit well, it usually doesn't sell. Just something to keep in mind! Many of us love medallion-style quilts but it's best to try to extend them into rectangles to fit queen-sized beds. Try adding additional borders at the top/bottom or even a pillow-tuck.

Lap-sized and other in-between sizes were also challenging to sell. That's not a new and while some always sell, it's a tougher sale. QB guests just don't understand how to use quilts of those sizes. I know that a lot of the current patterns/books/magazines show a lot of mid-sized quilts. They are certainly much quicker to make! However, when thinking about what sells, it's better to concentrate on what customers easily understand and can use in their homes.

So....what is purposeful quilting? It's making quilts that have a purpose, an intent – sizes, colors, and themes that work in most homes. Please feel free to reach out if you ever want to discuss your quilt ideas. I'm always happy to hear from you and help in any way possible.
